Potential Pedestrian connection to Illinois Road via. Sidewalk or Shared-use Path




IDOT Improvements

The Illinois Department of Transportation is completing a pavement rehabilitation project along U.S. Route 41 (Skokie Boulevard) from Old Glenview Road to I-94 (Edens Expressway). The improvement will include:

- Pavement Resurfacing
- ADA Improvements and ramp repair
- Replacement of Concrete medians along U.S. Route 41 (Skokie Boulevard) with painted and landscaped medians.

Potential Pedestrian Alternatives Lake Avenue to Illinois Road - Looking North


Alternative 1: 10-foot Shared-use Path with Crossing at Edens Plaza Intersection Alternativ

The Village is investigating potential pedestrian and bicycle alternatives, pending availability of funding, from Lake Avenue to Illinois Road.

Alternative 1 - Construct a 10-foot shared-use path along the west side of U.S. Route 41 (Skokie Boulevard) from Lake Avenue to Edens Plaza. At Edens Plaza, the shared-use path crosses to the east side of the roadway and continues to Illinois Road. The path will be 5 feet from Skokie Boulevard. There will be impacts up to 20 feet beyond the public right-of-way. This alternative accommodates bicyclists and pedestrians.

Alternative 2 - Construct an 8-foot shared-use path along the east side of U.S. Route 41 (Skokie Boulevard) from Lake Avenue to Illinois Road. The path will be 5 feet from Skokie Boulevard. There will be impacts up to 5 feet beyond the public right-of-way. This alternative accommodates bicyclists and pedestrians.

Alternative 3 - Construct a 5-foot sidewalk along the west side of U.S. Route 41 (Skokie Boulevard) from Lake Avenue to Edens Plaza. At Edens Plaza, the sidewalk crosses to the east side of the roadway and continues to Illinois Road. The sidewalk will be 2 feet from Skokie Boulevard. There will be impacts up to 20 feet beyond the public right-of-way. This alternative does not accommodate bicyclists.

Alternative 4 - Construct a 5-foot sidewalk along the east side of U.S. Route 41 (Skokie Boulevard) from Lake Avenue to Illinois Road. The sidewalk will be 2 feet from Skokie Boulevard. There will be impacts up to 5 feet beyond the public right-of-way. This alternative does not accommodate bicycles.
