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



Provide pedestrian and bike accommodations along U.S. Route 41 (Skokie Boulevard) from Lake Avenue to Illinois Road



Modernize the U.S. Route 41 (Skokie Boulevard)/Lake Avenue and the U.S. Route 41 (Skokie Boulevard)/Edens Plaza traffic signals




Public Information Meeting #1

- Received concurrence from MSC (11/16/2020)




Proposed Lake Avenue Improvements



- Resurface Lake Avenue
- Reduce northeast and southwest corner radii
- Reduce lane width eastbound curb lane
- Remove northwest and southeast corner islands

- Reduce crosswalk distances and provide one straight crossing
- ADA compliant crossings
- Modernize traffic signal


Proposed Lake Avenue Typical Section

Proposed U.S. Route 41 (Skokie Boulevard) Bicycle and Pedestrian Improvements




- Proposed 8-ft to 10-ft shared-use path will provide bicycle and pedestrian connection from Lake Avenue to Illinois Road
- Locates crossing at Edens Plaza traffic signal
- Minimum 5-foot separation between path and U.S. Route 41 (Skokie Boulevard) face of curb

- Impacts up to 20 feet beyond existing right-of-way
- Maintain existing drainage patterns
- U.S. Route 41 (Skokie Boulevard) roadway improvements limited to pavement marking modifications and ADA and crosswalk improvements


Proposed U.S. Route 41 (Skokie Boulevard) Bicycle and Pedestrian Improvements



- Proposed 8-ft to 10-ft shared-use path will provide bicycle and pedestrian accommodations from Lake Avenue to Illinois Road
- Minimum 5-foot separation between path and U.S. Route 41 (Skokie Boulevard) face of curb
- Impacts up to 5 feet beyond existing right-of-way/easements
- Storm sewer and drainage swale improvements
- Tree impacts and proposed landscaped buffer adjacent to homes

Proposed Right-of-Way

Phase I Study

- Construction of the preferred improvement plan will require temporary easement and permanent rightof-way acquisition of private property in some areas.
- Public Law 91-646

Right-of-Way Acquisition and Relocation Assistance for all Federal-Aid projects is governed by Public Law 91-646: Title III of the Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Policies Act of 1970, and the Uniform Relocation Act Amendments of 1987.

Purpose of Acquisition Process

To encourage and expedite acquisition by agreement, to avoid litigation and to assure consistent treatment for property owners.

Law Requires "Just Compensation"

Just Compensation is defined as payment of fair market value for the property taken, taking into account partial takings, damages and benefits to the remaining land.

4 Step Acquisition Process

Preparation of Plat of Survey and Legal Description of property to be acquired.

Preparation of Property Appraisal by independent professional appraiser.

Preparation of Review Appraisal by another independent appraiser.


Negotiations with property owners.

• Acquisition Schedule

Negotiations cannot begin until Design Approval is received.

Design Approval is anticipated in Summer 2021.


