INDEPENDENCE DAY 2014 CELEBRATION - THURSDAY, JULY 3RD

The Independence Day 2014 Celebration, hosted by the Wilmette Park District, will take place on Thursday, July 3rd, at Gillson Park. Please note: The annual Fun Run/Walk for Fun—beginning and ending in Gillson Park—will be held on Friday, July 4th.

Games and rides for children, entertainment, roving performers, and a Tastefest are all part of the festivities beginning at 4:00 p.m. on Thursday, July 3rd. A traditional concert of patriotic music by the Palatine Concert Band is scheduled for 7:30 p.m. in the Wallace Bowl. It will be preceded by a sneak preview of this summer's Starlight Theatre musical feature, *Annie Get Your Gun*, at 7:15 p.m. The Grand Fireworks display lights up the sky at 9:30 p.m.

Take a Pace Bus to Gillson Park Fireworks

Parking in and near Gillson Park is limited. The easiest way to get to and from the Independence Day celebrations is by using the special Pace shuttle bus service. Motorists may park at Edens Plaza or at the METRA commuter lot. The shuttle bus route will run from Edens Plaza east on Lake Street, south on 12th Street and east on Central Avenue to Gillson Park where passengers will be dropped on Michigan Avenue south of Washington Avenue. Passengers will be picked up all along the route. The shuttle will run about every 10 minutes between 4:00 p.m. and 6:00 p.m. and then every 5 minutes between 6:00 p.m. and 9:00 p.m. After the fireworks, the last bus leaves Gillson Park at 11:00 p.m. The charge is \$3.50 round trip, exact fare ONLY, and it will be collected eastbound. Tickets will be issued for the return trip. You will be required to present a ticket for the return trip. Riders with a valid Circuit Ride Free permit and children under 7 are free.

Look for the special marked loading areas at the park for your return trip:

- ★ Blue Route: All Stops
- ★ Yellow Route: Metra & all stops up to Lake & Ridge
- ★ Red Route: Express to Edens Plaza

Motorists who do not live near the bus route are encouraged to park their cars for free at the Wilmette Metra commuter lot or the Village Hall lot for a short bus ride to Gillson Park. Or alternatively, park on side streets along the bus route, parking lots around Lake & Ridge, or at Edens Plaza (in the evening), and ride the bus from there.

Important Traffic and Pedestrian Safety Information

Please consider taking public transportation for the July 3rd festivities. When arriving at the park, please make note of the following:

- ★ Beginning at 6:00 p.m., Sheridan Road will be closed to all vehicle traffic between Lake and Isabella.
- ★ A drop-off and pick-up zone will be established in the 900 block of Michigan. Traffic will enter east on Forest and exit west on Lake. Signs will be posted along Sheridan Road north of Lake directing vehicles to this zone.
- ★ Due to the large amount of pedestrian traffic, if you park in the beach lot the Police Department will hold all vehicle traffic leaving Gillson Park until the majority of the pedestrian traffic has cleared the top of the hill. Please expect to wait in your car until the pedestrian traffic has cleared. We appreciate your patience!

Letter from Village President Bob Bielinski

Spring is finally here in Wilmette, but the touch of snow we received on May 16th reminded all of us of the very difficult winter we experienced this year. The unprecedented, recurring cycle of snow followed by bitter cold tested all of us, including Village employees who put in long hours during the storms. I would like to extend an especially big thank you to our Public Works staff who worked tirelessly clearing our streets and keeping it safe to navigate throughout the Village this past winter.

Downtown Events

The Village's downtown area is experiencing a restaurant renaissance as more and more dining options have become available. Many of these restaurants have outdoor seating which is a great way to enjoy all that downtown Wilmette has to offer this summer.

Our downtown restaurants are working with the Village to sponsor "Wednesdays in Wilmette" which will feature live music on the streets of the Village Center. Scheduled to begin on June 11th, we expect this to be a monthly summer event which will bring our community together and draw people from neighboring villages to our downtown. Look for an announcement of future dates soon.

The Wilmette Theatre is celebrating its 100th anniversary this year. The Theatre's recent Kickstarter campaign raised money to purchase a new digital projector, which is a critical upgrade necessary to show the latest theatrical releases. Also, hundreds of people came together downtown for an evening of fun with friends during the 2nd Wilmette Pub Crawl which benefited two local youth charities, Warming House and Youth Connection. Thank you to all who supported these organizations, and stay tuned for more upcoming events.

Elmwood Dunes

Along the lakefront, the restoration of Elmwood Dunes Preserve is underway. The Village in cooperation with the Friends of Elmwood Dunes cleared undesirable vegetation in May, and on June 14th, the group will begin planting in the hilltop garden. In addition, I would like to thank the Rotary Club of Wilmette Harbor for its recent generosity in awarding a \$25,000 grant for the Elmwood Dunes Preserve. This funding is critical to the restoration of Elmwood Dunes and its becoming a treasured natural resource for our community. This lasting gift marks the 25th anniversary of the Wilmette Harbor Rotary Club's establishment and its continued commitment to service to our community.

Economic Development

Downtown restaurants are not the only new businesses opening in Wilmette. A new Marriott Residence Inn recently opened on the west side of the Village, near the Edens Expressway. It is a beautiful modern facility, and I encourage you to check it out. The Village Board and staff also continue to work with real estate developers on proposals for a mixed-use development at 611 Green Bay Road.

Water Contract Extension

The Village's water plant produces water for use by not only residents and businesses of Wilmette, but also for the Village of Glenview. The water supply contract with Glenview was due to expire in 2020, and the parties recently agreed to an extension through 2050. By ensuring continued revenue from our biggest water customer and adding a new customer (North Maine Utilities serving parts of Maine Township) starting in 2020, this agreement helps secure Wilmette's financial future.

Stormwater Action Plan

The Village Board and staff are fully committed to reducing the impact of major storm events on our residents and businesses. Since 1992, the Village has invested more than \$52 million in engineering, planning and construction projects for our sewer systems.

Last year, the Village Board approved a \$24 million Stormwater Action Plan to improve residents' quality of life by modernizing our aging stormwater and sanitary sewer infrastructure. The largest of the upcoming projects is the construction of the 5.5 million gallon underground storage reservoir under West Park. The Village is partnering with the Wilmette Park District to build a mutually beneficial project that will improve sewer performance during storms for over 1,300 home owners in west Wilmette and modernize West Park with synthetic turf and new amenities.

The Village is also well underway with its study of the stormwater sewer system in the area of the Village west of Ridge Road. This study will identify short and long-term drainage improvements to reduce the risk of flooding during major rain events. The stormwater study kicked off in March with a series of Resident Open Houses attended by over 160 residents. A special thank you to those residents who shared their flooding experiences with engineering staff and consultants.

INDEPENDENCE DAY FUN RUN & WALK FRIDAY, JULY 4TH, IN GILLSON PARK

The Fun Run, Walk for Fun and Youth Run are among the most popular events held in Gillson Park during our Independence Day Celebration. Please note: This year's race will be held on Friday, July 4—the day after the fireworks. The contests begin at 8:00 a.m. for both the Adult Run and Walk. The Youth events are held between 9:15 – 9:55 a.m.

There are six categories for men and women in the Fun Run contest, with awards presented in all categories. The Walk for Fun is for recreation only—no awards are presented. The Youth Run has four age groups—6-7, 8-9, 10-11 and 12-13—to accommodate the large number of entrants. Pee Wee runners are age 5 and under. Awards are given in each of the children's categories.

Early adult registrations are \$25—on the day of the event the adult fee is \$30. The youth registration fee is \$10. Note: Pee Wees (5 & under) run for free and registration is not required. Early registrants will receive a T-shirt. Register online at www.wilmettepark.org until noon on July 2nd. In-person registration can be done at the Administrative Offices in Village Hall, 1200 Wilmette Ave. and at the Community Recreation Center, 3000 Glenview Rd. until 2:00 p.m. on July 3rd. Registration will also be available in Gillson Park the evening of July 3rd and on the morning of the race.

DOCUMENT DESTRUCTION AND ELECTRONICS RECYCLING EVENT

On Saturday, September 6th, the Village will partner with the Solid Waste Agency of Northern Cook County (SWANCC) to host a one-day Document Destruction & Electronics Recycling Event. The event is open to all Wilmette residents, and residents of all other SWANCC communities, and will run from 9:00 a.m. to noon at the Wilmette Public Works Facility, located at 711 Laramie Ave. Materials from businesses, schools, or institutions will not be accepted. DOCUMENT DESTRUCTION GUIDELINES

Paper documents must be brought to the event in either paper shopping bags or cardboard boxes - **NO PLASTIC BAGS** please! To avoid back-up or capacity issues, we must limit residents to six file-size boxes or paper shopping bags per vehicle. Paper clips and staples do not need to be removed, but please remove binders.

WILMETTE EARNS TREE CITY USA RECOGNITION

For the 30th consecutive year, the Village of Wilmette is proud to be recognized by the Arbor Day Foundation as a "Tree City USA" community. Wilmette continues to maintain the standards required of a Tree City with a comprehensive forestry program that includes planting trees, tree care ordinances, and conducting an Arbor Day ceremony with all duties administered by the Public Works Forestry Division. The Tree City USA designation is sponsored by the Arbor Day Foundation in cooperation with the National Association of State Foresters and the USDA Forest Service.

WATERING REGULATIONS IN EFFECT

During the warm weather months, water restrictions are imposed by the Village as required by the State of Illinois. Sprinkling is prohibited Monday through Friday from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m through September 15th. Sprinkling during prohibited hours may be permitted for a limited time by the Director of Engineering, for newly seeded or sod areas, and for the annual activation or repair of sprinkler systems. To obtain special approval, call (847) 853-7660.

LEAF BLOWER REGULATIONS IN EFFECT

Between May 15th and September 30th, the Village of Wilmette prohibits the use of gasoline-powered leaf blowers. This prohibition includes using an electric leaf blower powered by a portable gasoline generator.

The only exceptions to this prohibition are:

- ★ Use on golf courses, public parks or other Wilmette Park District property
- ★ Use for roof, gutter and downspout cleaning
- ★ Use in paving, repair or patching of public streets and alleys, or for preparation of private asphalt surfaces prior to seal coating.

Residents can aid in helping to curtail the nuisance caused in summer months by leaf blowers - please speak to your landscaping contractor and tell them not to use their leaf blowers during the summer months.

HEALTH BEAT

Flu Vaccine

This fall, the seasonal influenza vaccine administration for Wilmette residents will be held on October 9th from 8:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. on the second floor of the Village Hall. The flu shots will be given to those residents over the age of 18 years. Appointments are necessary and can be made by calling the Health Department at (847) 853-7507 or by email, baderd@wilmette.com.

The fee for the flu shot is \$25.00. Residents who have Medicare Part B as their primary insurer may choose to receive their immunization with Medicare paying the fee. Medicare will not pay the Village if you belong to an HMO.

Caution: The vaccine should not be taken if you have a known allergy to eggs or egg products, have a fever, or if you have previously experienced an allergic reaction to the vaccine.

CPR Course Offered

A CPR course for residents will be offered on Thursday, July 17th and Wednesday, September 17th from 6:30 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. There is a fee of \$20 for class materials payable prior to the class. Blood Pressure Screenings are held on Tuesdays, from 3:00 p.m. to 4:30 p.m. in the Health Department office located on the second floor of the Village Hall. No appointment is necessary.

Cholesterol and Glucose Screening

The Health Department is offering a Lipid Profile and Glucose screening for residents on Wednesday, July 16th and September 17th from 9:00 a.m. to 10:00 a.m. in the Training Room of the Village Hall. This screening is by appointment only and requires a 12 hour fast. The Lipid Profile includes tests for total cholesterol, HDL cholesterol, LDL cholesterol, Triglycerides, and HDL/LDL ratio. The glucose screening is for the detection of diabetes. The test requires blood drawn from the arm and the results are sent in the mail within 48 hours. The cost of this test is \$20. HISTORIC PRESERVATION AWARDS

The Village of Wilmette Historic Preservation Commission is requesting nominations for its 22nd Annual Historic Preservation Awards Program. Nominations are open to residential, commercial, public and religious buildings as well as landscapes within the village limits.

Nomination categories are:

- ★ *Stewardship Awards* acknowledge property owners of five years or longer who have retained the historic appearance of their property.
- ★ *Restoration Awards* acknowledge projects in which a building, garden or landscape has been returned to its historic appearance. The restoration of an interior space will also be eligible.
- ★ *Sympathetic Addition Awards* acknowledge alterations or additions to existing structures which are sensitive to their historic character.
- ★ *Streetscape Compatibility Awards* acknowledge exceptional examples of new construction which are sympathetic to the historic character of their neighborhoods or settings.

The nominated sites will be judged by a panel of preservation professionals and the winners will be honored at a special award ceremony in the fall. SPEED LIMIT SIGNAGE

In an effort to reduce sign pollution and beautify the Village, the Village Board passed an Ordinance implementing a Village-wide speed limit of 25 miles per hour unless otherwise posted. This Ordinance does not change any existing speed limits or school zone restrictions in the Village but rather allows a significant reduction in the amount of posted signs. Signs notifying commuters of the speed limit will be posted at entrances to the Village. This will not impact signage in school zones.
