### Attempt Residential Burglary

Between 5:00 PM on Friday, June 7th and 7:45 AM on Saturday, June 8th, an unknown offender(s) entered the yard of a residence in the 100 block of Maple Ave. The offender(s) removed the window well cover and window screen, but did not gain entry.

### Auto Burglary

During the past two weeks, Wilmette Police Department has taken nine (9) reports on burglaries to motor vehicles during the overnight hours. **All the vehicles had been left unlocked.** The offender(s) took electronics, wallets, a brief case, garage door openers and US currency. The burglaries occurred in the following locations and time periods

- (6) auto burglaries in the 2100 to 2300 block of Schiller Ave -May 25th to May 26th;
- (1) auto burglary in the 900 block of Locust Rd -May 25th to May 26th;
- (1) auto burglary in the 200 block of Hibbard Rd - May 30th to June 4th; and,
- (1) auto burglary in the 900 block of 15th Street - June 3rd to June 4th.

**Always lock your car doors and remove the keys and valuables from your automobiles. Always lock your garage and home doors and windows. Immediately contact the Wilmette Police by dialing 9-1-1 if you see or hear something suspicious.**
