# Community CRIME ALERT

### Residential Burglary

On Tuesday, December 29th at 6:50 PM, a resident in the 400 block of Beverly Drive woke up and discovered an unknown subject had broken into his house by prying a rear door. The subject was going through drawers in the master bedroom. The subject fled carrying a pillowcase that contained the resident's jewelry. The resident chased this subject out of the house and confronted this subject prior to him getting into a vehicle that was occupied by a second subject. This subject and the second subject, who got out of the vehicle, hit and kicked the resident to get him to let go of the first subject. They then fled northbound on Beverly Drive in the vehicle, a red SUV or station wagon. The resident was able to get the pillowcase with some of their jewelry from the offenders before they fled. But it appears that the offender did take other jewelry in addition to the jewelry in the pillowcase.

The first offender was described as a male white approximately 25-30 YOA with dirty blond hair, an athletic build and wearing a blue jacket. The second offender was described as either an Asian or Hispanic male approximately 25-30 YOA, short and stocky.

### Catalytic Converter Theft

The Wilmette Police have taken two reports of an unknown offender(s) removing and taking a catalytic converter from a parked vehicle. The first incident occurred during the overnight hours of Thursday, December 17th and Friday, December 18th. The vehicle was a Jeep Cherokee that was parked in the 600 block of Hibbard Rd.

The second incident occurred between Saturday, December 20th and Sunday, December 27th. The vehicle was a Toyota Prius that was parked in the 100 block of Park Ave.
