### **Residential Burglary & Motor Vehicle Theft**

Between 2:00 AM and 3:00 AM on Tuesday, February 4th, unknown offenders entered an unlocked vehicle that was parked in a driveway in the 1000 block of Seminole Rd. They used a garage door opener that was found in the unlocked car to open the attached garage. Offenders entered both unlocked vehicles parked in the garage, both with keys left inside. The offenders stole only one vehicle because the other vehicle was blocked in by a parked car in the driveway. The stolen vehicle was later recovered by Wilmette Detectives in a south suburb.

### **Attempt Residential Burglary**

Between 11:00 AM on Friday, January 31st and 4:30 PM on Sunday, February 2nd, unknown offender(s) attempted to gain entry to a residence in the 200 block of Skokie Blvd. The offender(s) had unsuccessfully attempted to pry the rear sliding door off the track.

### **Auto Burglaries**

On Tuesday, January 28th, the Wilmette Police Department took seven (7) reports of burglaries to unlocked motor vehicles that occurred during the overnight hours of Monday, January 27th and Tuesday, January 28th. The offender(s) searched the vehicles taking a purse, cash and change. The burglaries occurred in the following blocks:

- 700 block of Park Ave
- 300 block of Vista Dr
- 2200 block of Birchwood Ave
- 2900 block of Hartzell Ave
- 300 block of Hibbard Rd
- 200 block of Valley View Dr
- 700 block of Lavergne Ave

Always lock your car, home & garage doors and windows. Do not leave purses and wallets in a location visible from a first floor window or door. Immediately contact the Wilmette Police by dialing 9-1-1 if you see or hear something suspicious.
